Perform This concept involves understanding that music is created to be performed	Sing from memory with accurate pitch

Compose This concept involves appreciating that music is created through a process which has a number of techniques	Compose and perform melodic songs
	Use sound to create abstract effects
	Use drones as accompaniments
	Use digital technologies to compose pieces of music
Transcribe This concept involves understanding that compositions need to be understood by others and that there are techniques and a language for communicating them	 Recognise the symbols for a minim and semibreve and say how many beats it represents
	Recognise the notes EGBDF on the musical stave
Appraise/Describe Music	Use terms duration, timbre, pitch, texture and use of silence to describe music
This concept involves appreciating the features of musical elements	Understand layers of sound and discuss their effect on mood and feelings
